HOW DOES EXECUTIVE FUNCTIONING DEVELOP?

Executive Functioning skill is a current “buzz” word, though in reality always was encompassed in the world of occupational functioning. Sensory Processing is the foundation on which skills are built in early developmental years and prepares for executive functioning ability. This workshop will discuss how the developmental hierarchy of learning impacts on skills such as the ability to organize, to write what you are thinking, to adhere to timelines, to be disciplined in study methods.
