## THE SCHOOL-SAVVY THERAPIST: WORKING WITH KIDS, FAMILIES AND SCHOOLS

Clinical knowledge of children and families does not necessarily translate into knowledge about when and how to contact schools or how to work with them collaboratively. This workshop is designed to provide a framework and guidelines for doing so. We will review how therapists (and other clinicians) can come to understand the child and family in the school setting, and what we can do to foster a supportive child-family-school dynamic.

Trained at the Philadelphia Child Guidance Clinic, she treated children and families and coordinated the Clinic's consultation services to local public and private schools. For over twenty-five years she was the consulting psychologist at Abington Friends School. Mary is in private practice, treating children, adults, couples and families. Her book *The School-Savvy Therapist: Working with Kids, Families and Schools* was recently published by W.W. Norton & Company.
