Today's clinical practice necessitates consideration of a myriad of ethical issues. How well do you balance conflicts between personal and professional values, your duties, and current liability risks? The purpose of this workshop is to provide practicing mental health professionals with guidance in order to negotiate many of these issues. Rather than focus on what psychologists need to do to avoid punishment, this workshop will focus on helping psychologists think through challenging ethical dilemmas.

Linda K. Knauss, Ph.D., ABPP is a Professor at Widener University's Institute for Graduate Clinical Psychology. Dr. Knauss is the Past-chair of the American Psychological Association's Ethics Committee, the American Board of Professional Psychology's Ethics Committee, the Pennsylvania Psychological Association's Ethics Committee, and has served as Co-chair of the Philadelphia Society of Clinical Psychologists' Ethics Committee. Dr. Knauss taught courses in ethics at Widener University, Immaculata University, and the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine. She has authored several book chapters and journal articles on ethics, and has taught many continuing education workshops on a variety of ethical issues.
